
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Pre-writing Skills:

Pre-writing skills are an important part of your child's development as they are the stepping stones to the handwriting skills your child will need to write legible letters. Pre-writing skills are necessary to master in the early years for many important reasons. Children need to master pre-writing skills before they can have legible and efficient handwriting. Pre-writing shapes include formation of vertical lines, horizontal lines, diagonal lines, circles, cross patterns, X patterns, squares and triangle shapes. Direction of formation of each line is important as well as proper formation will carry over into formation of letters in handwriting tasks. Each shape/line is formed with a top to down and left to right formation. Listed in the diagram below are the typical age ranges for abilities to form each shape.

Before your child can learn to write, he or she needs to be able to draw these shapes



Fun/play activities to engage your child in working on pre-writing skills:

- Use shaving cream to make lines, circles, shapes, letters or a picture
- Put paint in a ziplock baggie, seal it and tape it, and use your finger to make lines, circles, shapes, letters or a picture
- Use chalk to draw outside on sidewalk
- Use WET, DRY, TRY method- Take a dry erase board, draw a line, erase with a damp towel, and then try to draw again for increased motor planning
- Start with vertical strokes (up/down), progress to horizontal lines (left to right), circle, cross, left/right diagonals, "x", triangle and square
- Connect the dot activities
- Roll a dice game to draw a house
- Use Wikki Stix, pipe cleaners or toothpicks to practice forming simple shapes and letters
- Sticker play- peel and place stickers on lines, shapes, or letters
- Line up beads or pieces of cereal one a time on lines, shapes or letters
- Roll playdough into small straight pieces to practice making lines, shapes or letters

Proper grasping techniques to writing tools:

Achieving a proper grasp on writing tools can improve your child's control and legibility with formation of pre-writing shapes/lines. Listed below is a reference to desired age appropriate grasping strategies we work towards achieving when completing pre-writing activities.
